If you can use help with diapers, please go to this website and sign up. You will receive one case every 3 months. www.diaperlove.org If you need special formula that WIC does not cover, TennCare will pay for it.

If you have an infant that needs more formula than WIC provides, TennCare will pay for it.

If you have a child **over the age of 3** that is not potty trained due to being medically delayed, has physical issues, medical issues or other valid reasons, TennCare will pay for your diapers.

When you receive a child, please make sure that you ask for a "Love Bag." These are homemade bags that are made by local churches and businesses and contain a homemade blanket, age appropriate toy and personal items like toothbrush and toothpaste, brush and comb. These are the child's forever bag and it gives them something immediately that they can say is theirs. If the worker is not aware of these bags, refer them to Jill in the reception area at our DCS office.

When you receive a child in your home and you find that you have questions about possible sexual abuse or physical abuse that was never reported or any type of allegation that happens in your home, you need to contact the child's FSW and then contact the Child Abuse Hotline:

### 1-877-237-0004 or 1-877-54ABUSE (1-877-542-2873) for the following situations:

- the situation you are reporting is an abuse/neglect/child fatality emergency;
- you prefer to remain anonymous;
- you have insufficient data to complete the required information on the report;
- the suspected abuse/neglect you are reporting occurred outside the state of Tennessee and you do not know how to contact the state where it occurred.
- you are unsure if the report is imminent risk of harm
- you do not want e-mail confirmation of your report

When you receive a placement of a **school-age child**, please ask the child's caseworker for an **Educational Passport** to get your child enrolled in school. **Each school age foster child is to have one of these passports per Policy**

Please sign your child up for **Imagination Library**. Children 0-5 years old are eligible to receive a monthly book. <u>http://www.imaginationlibrary.com/</u>

Children in foster care are eligible to go to **Dollywood and Dollywood Splash Country once a year for free**. Simply contact your RPS, tell them the exact date that you will be going and the tickets will be waiting for you there. Your RPS will need a 14 days in advance notice. You can also turn these tickets in and receive credit toward the purchase of an annual pass.

Many times parents need furniture, toys, formula and specific clothing. On the other side, many parents have these things and want to get rid of them. Your local **Blount County Fire Department** station will come and check your smoke detectors, replace or add, and change batteries for free.

Free coats can be gotten at any time from Fire Department #7 on Sevier Rd. in Seymour. You will receive a light weight and a heavy coat per PERSON. This is not limited to children.

Our Goal this year is to get local churches and businesses involved with our Association. ### **Training Requirements for Traditional and Kinship Resource Parents**

DCS Policy requires resource parents to attend continuing education training. There are specific classes that first year and second year resource parents must take. You can find these training classes on the web at: <u>www.tn.gov/</u> Type **Foster Care** in search and go to **Resource Parent Training**.

Medication and CPR & First Aid are required every two years for everyone.
